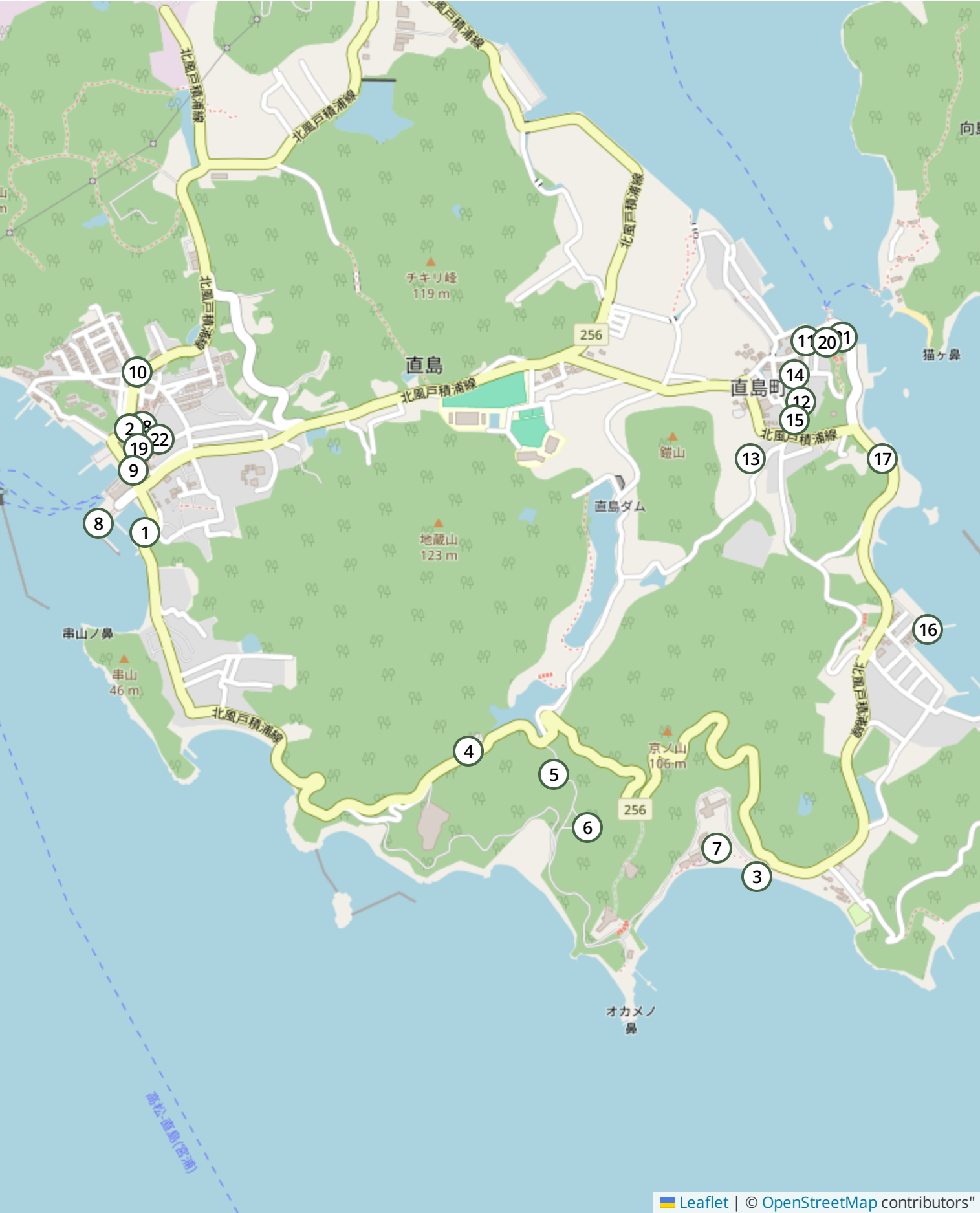
The art island of Japan.

The only way to explore Naoshima is by ebike. It may be tiny, but it is hilly, so the electric motor is a good choice.

Dotted around the island you will find sculptures, galleries and architecture from the greats, including; James Turrell, Tadao Ando and Lee Ufan. There is no top list for Naoshima, you must see it all, it is just too good.

And after a day of peddle power, there are tiny coffee shops and cafes for your caffeine and Japanese curry fix.





1 Naoshima Pavillion

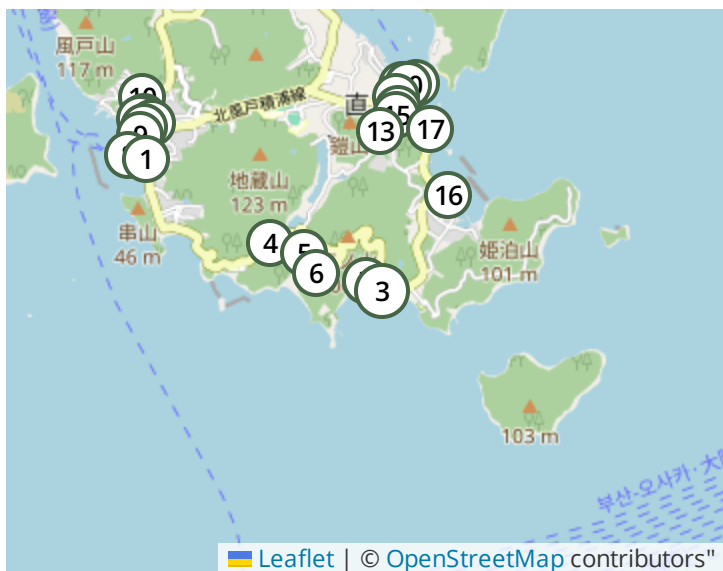
3 Yellow Pumpkin

Naoshima's most recognisable sculpture is Yayoi Kusama's Yellow Pumpkin.



Situated at the southern end of the island, this colossal pumpkin painted in a vivid shade of yellow stands tall against the blue waters.

Yellow Pumpkin can be visited by ebike or a leisurely stroll from other attractions on the island. Visiting in the early morning and late afternoon can ensure fewer crowds, giving visitors the chance to have a more intimate experience with the artwork.

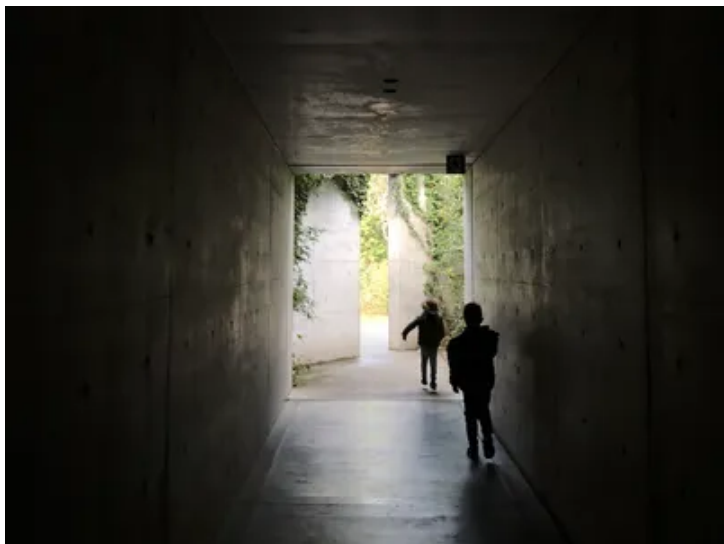


Chichu Art Museum

Immerse yourself in nature, light, and space at Chichu Art Museum featuring works by Monet, Turrell, and Walter De Maria. Serene and unforgettable.



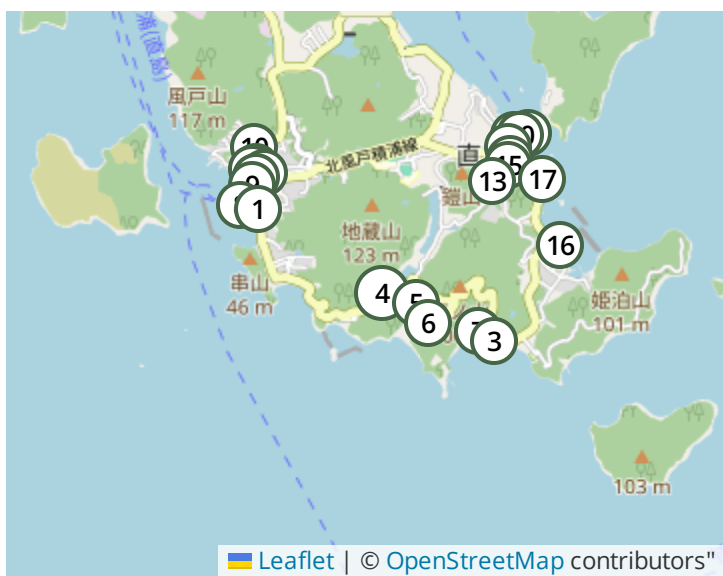

5 Lee Ufan Museum

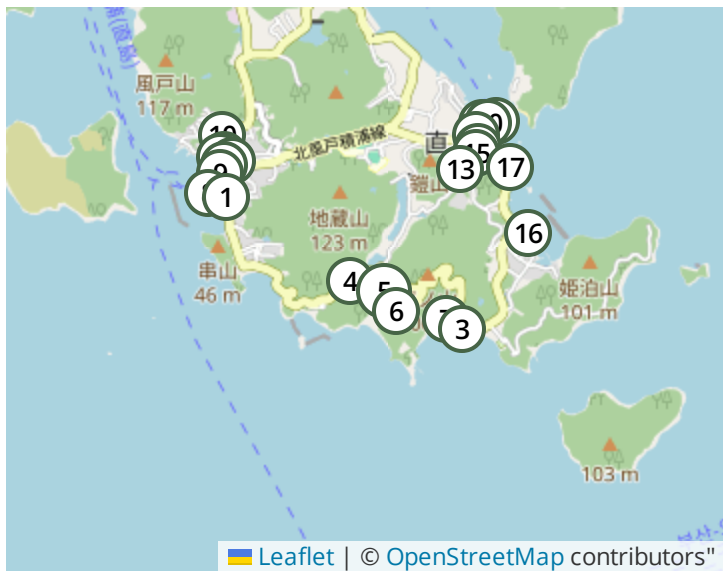
Indulge in Tadao Ando's architectural masterpiece at Lee Ufan Museum, and admire the interplay of space, nature, and art.

Visitors can contemplate Ufan's paintings and sculptures while appreciating the surrounding landscape. The highlight is the "Relatum" series, creating a dialog between natural and man-made. The meditative experience is a jewel in Naoshima's cultural offerings.

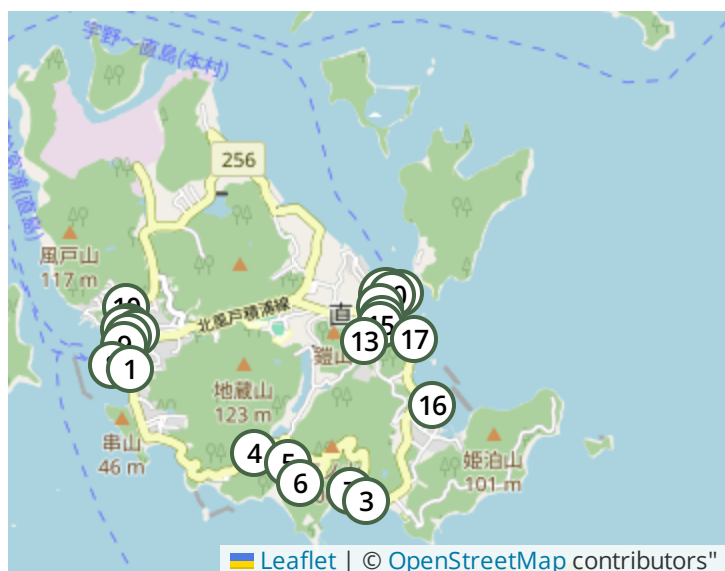
